### **CAL Cadet Band Member Responsibilities**

- Students are expected to:
  - attend all performances and rehearsals
  - come to lessons, rehearsals, and performances with all materials
  - practice regularly at home
  - dress appropriately for concerts
  - follow classroom/school rules and policies
  - be personally responsible for all of the information regarding band and making sure this information is passed onto parents/guardians
  - respect yourself, peers, property, and teacher
  - put all materials in their correct place after rehearsals and performances
  - Make an effort to learn and improve. Good attitude!!!

### **Classroom Rules**

In the CAL Cadet Band, we have three fundamental rules:

- **1.** Have RESPECT for: yourself, your peers, your instrument, school property, and teacher.
- **2. No gum or candy**. Gum and candy (or other highly sugary stuff, like pop) can <u>seriously</u> damage your instrument.
- 3. All cell phones must be put in the basket. NO cell phones out during rehearsal. This includes being on your stand.

### **Concert Attire**

CAL Cadet Bands have performances regularly throughout the year. Students are expected to follow the dress code. Failure to do so will result in 15 point loss, or the student being sent home to change.

### **Large Group Contest and Pictures**

- The rule: Black from the waist down and white from the waist up.

### Pep Band Attire

- Jeans, shorts, or capris with a school T-shirt or other school spirit wear

### **Performances**

The CAL Cadet Bands give numerous performances throughout the year. Please mark your calendars with the performance dates for the year. Note that attendance to **all** performances is required of all members. Absences from performances will be dealt on an individual basis, which may include a meeting with parents, administration, and Mr. Lockwood.

### **Grading Policy**

### 40% Performances (Concerts, Pep Rallies, Parades, etc.)

Attendance at all performances is required, except for serious illness or family emergency. The director must be notified BEFORE the performance. Any unexcused absence from a performance will result in an "0" for that performance.

### 30% Rehearsals (5 points daily)

Students must come to rehearsals with all materials (instrument, folder, lesson book, and pencil).

Students are expected to cooperate, be focused, and ready to learn.

Not having materials, especially your instrument; and behavior problems will result in a loss of point(s) for the day.

### 30% Lessons (per quarter)

Every student has a lesson once a week, either individually or in a group. Lessons come out of regular classes, so if a student can not come due to a test or quiz, he/she must email Mr. Lockwood by the end of the school day and let him know. Failure to email Mr. Lockwood will result in a "0" and must be made up. Students are expected to come prepared with instrument, all music, lesson book, and pencil. Students will be given a weekly assignment to practice. Students will earn a maximum of 20 points for their lesson depending on how well their assignment is prepared.

### 5th graders-- Need to have a signed practice chart when coming to lessons. The practice chart is worth half of their lesson points

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### \*\*\*\*\* Make up Lessons\*\*\*\*\*

To make up lessons, students must make arrangements with Mr. Lockwood and their teachers. After making arrangements, they may sign up on Mr. Lockwood's door. Before and after school times are also available.

#### \*\*\*\*Extra Credit\*\*\*\*

A student may earn extra credit by attending a concert, bringing back a program, and writing a paragraph on their experience. The concert has to be a symphony band, jazz band, or other instrumental group. No popular artists, choirs, or rock bands will count. Each concert is worth 5 points. The maximum amount of extra credit is 20 points per quarter.

### Supplies, Resale, and Rentals

### Reeds/Oil/Supplies

- The school keeps a limited supply of basic instrument needs on hand for resale.
- Reeds are sold at a discounted rate from the music store and will be sold in a quantity of three so that students can have multiple reeds prepared to play. Reeds take a little time to work into playing condition.
- Other items such as cork grease, cleaning swabs, neck straps, etc. may also be purchased directly from Rieman Music (641) 423-6563. They can deliver it to the school.

### **School-Owned Instruments**

- Bigger instruments such as french horns, tenor and baritone saxophone, baritones, and tubas are rented through the school.
- The school does own other instruments that can be rented as well, however it is always best to rent flutes, clarinets, alto saxes, trumpet, and trombones through the music store. Please contact the director for more information
- Rental fee for the year is \$60. The rental fee covers routine care and maintenance. This fee can be paid in full or in 2 payments of \$30 (by semester).

\*\*Important: While accidents do happen, major damage due to negligence will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian.
